Jennifer Prutsman-Pfeiffer is a pathologists' assistant in the department of Neuropathology and Postmortem Medicine at Strong Memorial Hospital . She began her career at Roswell Park Cancer Institute in 1995, after receiving her Master's degree in physical anthropology at the University of Tennessee-Knoxville and her Bachelor's from Wells College in Aurora , New York . She is a fellow of the American Association of Pathologists' Assistants and certified by the American Society for Clinical Pathology. Jennifer also serves as a consulting forensic anthropologist and has worked on cases in western and central New York State since 2000. She was one of thirty-three anthropologists helping identify victims after the collapse of the World Trade Center . Jennifer is a member of the Physical Anthropology section of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences, and is currently pursuing her doctorate in physical anthropology at the State University of New York at Buffalo . She has taught at the University of Rochester , Genesee Community College , St John Fisher College , and the Rochester Institute of Technology. Jennifer has developed and offered an annual workshop for police investigators, coroners, and attorneys at Genesee Community College called "Death Scenes and Recovery of Bodies", co-sponsored by The BEST Center and the Genesee County Sheriff's Office. Jennifer assisted the Memorial Art Gallery in an analysis of an Egyptian mummy for their "Protected for Eternity" exhibit.
